### PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION:

The Wesleyville District in the Borough of Wesleyville is one-fifth of a mile by one-tenth of a mile and includes 118 buildings (1804-2218, west side Water Road and 2019-2215 east side Water Road; 2008-2054 west side Riverside and 2011-2059 east side Riverside; 3509-3522 North Street; 3610-3630 north side South Street and 3515-3627 south side South Street; 3610-3628 north side Freemont; 3520 north side Edison; 3515-3523 south side Edison; 3516 north side Idlewood and 3509-3523 south side Idlewood; and 1605-1921 Market). this is a densely populated area, primarily residential with 106 houses on small lots. There are also 11 commercial buildings in the district.

The most common house style in the Wesleyville District is the bungalow. Some examples are found along Riverside Drive at 2015, 2019, and 2031. Others are located at Water Road numbers 2012, 2031, and 2056; 3623-3629 on freemont Street are also bungalows. Most of these bungalows have retained very little original detailing. While a well-preserved bungalow is situated at 1901 Market, and has retained a number of original details, it is not architecturally significant. Among the five Queen Anne style houses, the one at 3528 Buffalo Road has retained some details in spite of being heavily altered and converted to a commercial The other prominent house style is a 1 1/2 story, ca. structure. 1920, like those located at 2048 and 2111 Water Road and 2027 Riverside Drive. None of these resources are significant architecturally. Other houses in the district include Cape Cods and vernacular dwellings from the 1920s. Few of the remaining houses have retained a high degree of integrity.

Of the 11 commercial buildings in the district, five are modern and three are older than fifty years, with little integrity retained. One commercial building is concrete block clad in metal tiles.

# PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION:

### HISTORICAL NARRATIVE

The Wesleyville District does not meet any of the criterion for the National Register eligibility. In 1825, Almond and Polly Fuller were deeded 193 acres in what is now Wesleyville. The town laid out until 1828 when a Methodist Church was not constructed. In 1912, Wesleyville became a borough. particular district was developed after the town became a borough. Wesleyville historically was a small town outside of Erie. It grew around some older farms and vernacular house forms which still exist in the district. According to the USGS map of 1899 Wesleyville was thinly settled with approximately six structures. One of these buildings survives at 2118 Water road. This area like many surrounding areas of Erie county was used primarily for farming. After the town was established it grew and newer houses appeared. The 1920s were a time of expansion and evidence of this are the 65 bungalow.

This district is characterized by tightly placed houses on level city lots. Most of the houses are frame and exhibit simple vernacular details. Few of the houses in the district are modern. The commercial development is focused around Buffalo Road where there are several two-story stores from the 1920s and 1930s. This area was soon affected by Erie's expansion and this became another area of the city. It is also near many of the large plants in the area.
